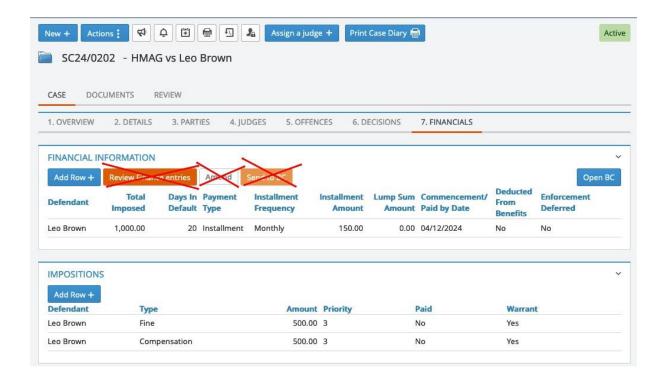
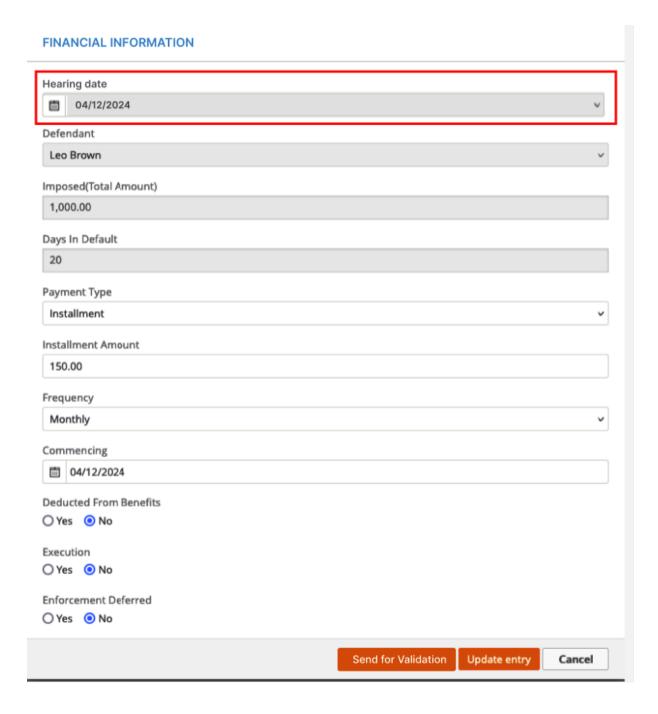
## Replacement of the financial review with the validation process

- 1. Inclusion of financial information to the Validation process
  - 1.1 Removal of the Review, Amend and Send to BC actions on the financial tab.

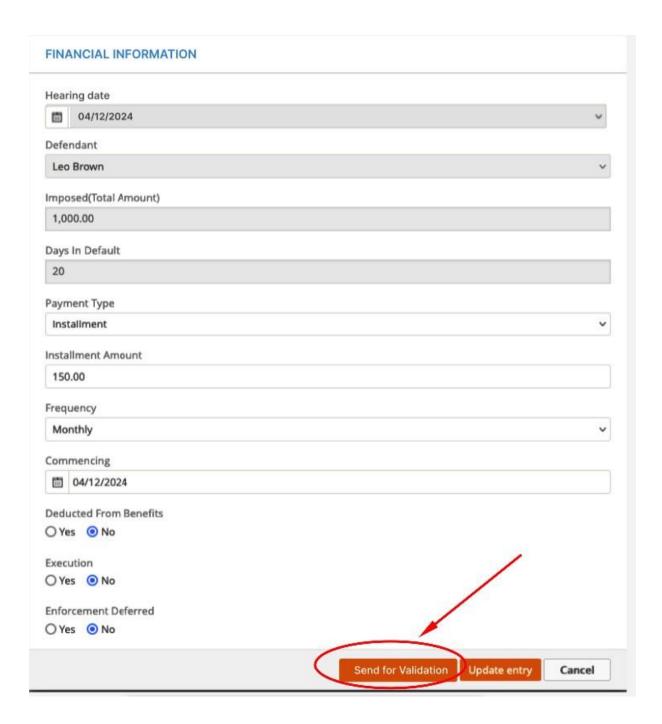


1.2 Addition of the hearing date to the financial information dialogue.

Automatic population of the hearing date from the decision tab (read only).



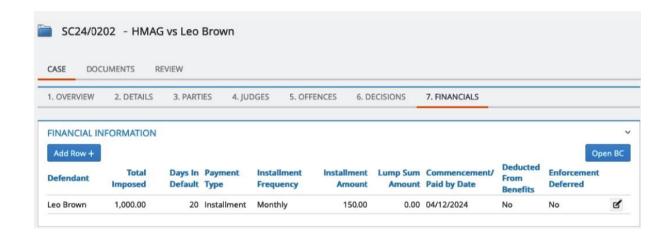
1.3 Addition of the "Send for Validation" action to the financial dialogue. The User selects one financial information entry, fills in the data and they can either update the entry or send it for Validation. Each financial entry is sent for validation individually.



1.4 Send the financial information to the Validation dashboard. The financial information sent to the Validation dashboard will include the following hearing details: date, court, case, defendant and prosecutor details. The Judiciary can either validate or amend/query the financial information as it is now for the other types of results.

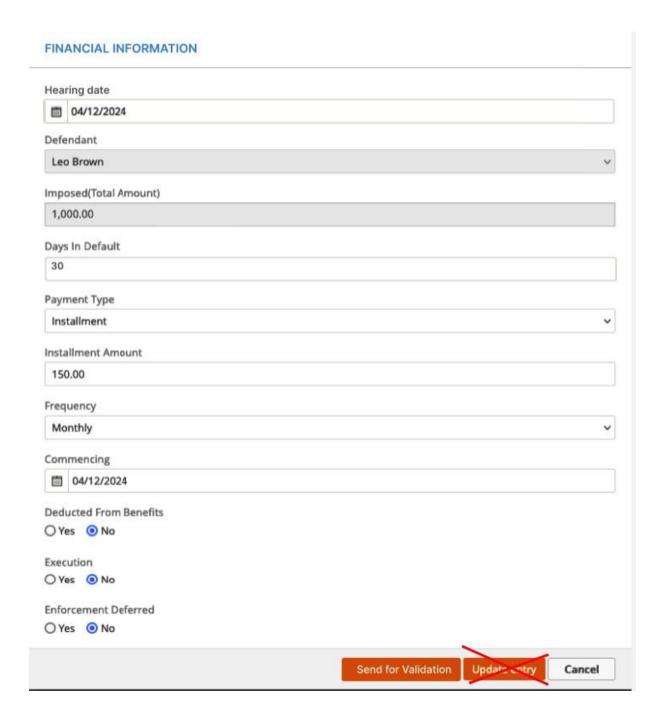


- 1.5 Financial information validation. The financial information entry becomes read only after validation and it is automatically transferred to BC. To prevent sending to BC impositions without their payment terms, the Judiciary is forced to validate the payment terms first. A pop up message will inform the judiciary that is trying to validate impositions without validating their payment terms first.
- 1.6 Amendment of validated Financial Information. The User clicks on the amend button next to each financial entry row. A new window pops-up to record the reason for the change.



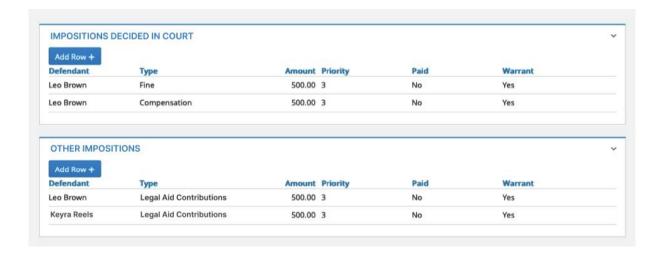
1.7 All fields becomes editable, apart from the Defendant and Total imposed fields. The User can select a new hearing date, if the payment terms are changed as a result of a new decision.

The User can't save any changes to the financial information entry without sending them for Validation too. The Update Entry button is disabled.



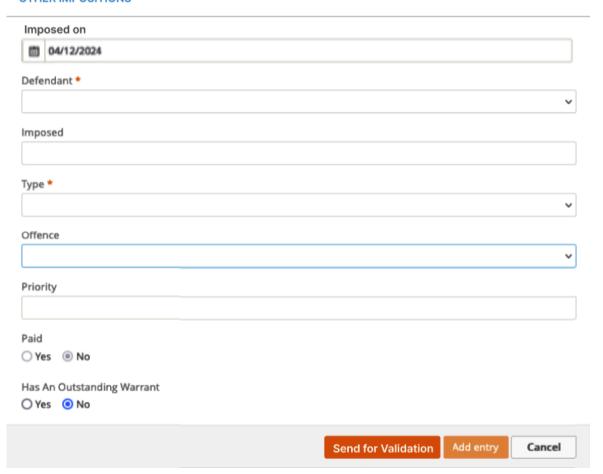
## 2. Inclusion of Impositions generated outside a hearing to the Validation process

2.1 Split of the Imposition section into "Impositions decided in Court" and "Other Impositions". The first section will include the impositions generated on a hearing while the latter is used for recording impositions generated outside of a hearing.



2.2 Addition of the "Imposed on" date field and the "Send for Validation" action to the "Other impositions" section.

## OTHER IMPOSITIONS



- 2.3 The Validation process of "Other impositions" and their postvalidation amendment will follow the same steps indicated for Validating the Financial information:
  - Each other imposition entry is sent for validation individually.
  - The judiciary is forced to validate the financial information (payment terms) first to prevent sending missing data to BC.
  - After Validation, the "Other Imposition" entry becomes readonly and they are sent to BC.
  - Users can amend payment terms and resend them for validation.
